### *A Call to a Deeper Experience*

Christ, the True Witness, addresses the church at Ephesus saying, "I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love. Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent." Revelation 2:4, 5. What effect have these words had upon the church? Have the professed people of God understood the import of the words, "Except thou repent," "I will come unto thee quickly"—when you are at ease, careless, filled with spiritual negligence—"and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent." When warnings come no more to the

people of God, when tender admonitions from the Spirit of God are silent, when the candle of heavenly illumination shines no longer upon their pathway, they will be left to kindle their own fire, and to walk in the sparks of their own kindling.

Many sermons are preached that are as Christless as was the offering of Cain, and heavenly intelligences look with amazement and sorrow upon the self-tainted, worthless offering. Could men realize how their services are regarded by heaven, they would humble themselves before God. Many workers have educated themselves as keen debaters and

## Dear Brothers and Sisters ...

Here is a Bible principle that we should take to heart: "Owe no man any thing" (Romans 13:8), for "The rich rule over the poor, and the borrower is slave to the lender" (Proverbs 22:7). When we owe, the lender can rule over us, make things difficult, and even try to control us.

Recently, we had a refrigerator needing replaced. Since COVID, we have been living paycheck to paycheck, barely saving anything with my secular job. I recently took on a part-time computer programming role that promised twenty hours a week. At that rate, it would take three weeks to accumulate enough funds for a refrigerator, sales tax, and delivery fee. We were anxious to get the new item, as the old one was freezing our food in the fridge section, and sometimes not having it cold enough without adjusting the temperature controls. Needless to say, we were beginning to experience food waste.

Though we could have ordered it at the beginning of this new employment and arranged to not have to pay for it until 4 weeks later; the worrisome part was the commitment to a potential loan if something went wrong. So, we disciplined ourselves and waited for that third week to be completed at work before ordering it. And that was a good thing, because what was not told to me about the new employment was that if I needed help from a third party, all programming would have to be put on hold and have to wait until the

third party responds. Therefore, at the time of this writing, I worked a mere four hours instead of twenty, and the following week looks to be a total of zero hours, as I am still waiting for a reply from a third-party company.

If we had ordered the refrigerator right away and I had happened to run into a work pause in my first week, that anticipated three pay-days to be ready to pay off the appliance without incurring any interest could have been in jeopardy. On the personal note, everything did work out because we waited and are enjoying the new appliance. On top of that, we received a \$300 refund blessing. All glory to God!

But the point of this happens to be even what Ellen White states:

"Be determined never to incur another debt. Deny yourself a thousand things rather than run in debt. This has been the curse of your life, getting into debt. Avoid it as you would the smallpox.

"Make a solemn covenant with God that by His blessing you will pay your debts, and then owe no man anything if you live on porridge and bread. It is so easy in preparing your table to throw out of your pocket twenty-five cents for extras. Take care of the pennies, and the dollars will take care of themselves. It is the mites here and the mites there that are spent for this, that, and the other that soon run up into dollars. Deny self at least while you are walled in

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critics, but have they the example of Christ for dealing with souls in this way? No; and unless this class of workers shall humble their hearts before God, they cannot sit with Christ upon His throne. Only those who have the spirit of a little child will enter into the kingdom of heaven.

Should Christ come to our world as He came at His first advent, many would criticize Him who imagine themselves to be children of God. Those who think they are keen, smart men, who are wise in their own conceit, need to know Jesus and Him crucified. They need to understand the power of His grace. All our hope is founded and sustained by Christ; then when our ministers fall on the Rock and are broken, they will say, More of Christ and less of theories.

Oh, how few know the day of their visitation. How few even among those who believe in present truth, understand the signs of the times, or what they are to experience before the end. We are under divine forbearance today; but how long will the angels of God continue to hold the winds that they shall not blow? We are convinced that among the people of God there is blindness of mind, and hardness of heart, although God has manifested inexpressible mercy toward us. How few there are who are truly humble, devoted, God-fearing servants in the cause of Christ, whose hearts are full of gratitude and thanksgiving because they are called to act a part in the work of God, being co-laborers with Jesus Christ, partakers with Christ of His sufferings! How few there are who can say from the heart, This light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal

weight of glory; while we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are unseen; for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which are unseen, are eternal.

Today there are few who are heartily serving God. The most of those who compose our congregation are spiritually dead in trespasses and sins. They come and go like the door upon its hinges. For years they have complacently listened to the most solemn, soul-stirring truths, but they have not practiced them. They are less and less sensible of the preciousness and value of truth, because they neglect the practice of those things which are pleasing in the sight of God. The stirring testimonies of reproof and warning do not arouse them. The sweetest melodies that come from God through human lips—justification by faith and the righteousness of Christ—do not bring forth from them a response of love and gratitude.

Though the heavenly Merchantman displays before them the richest jewels of faith and love, though His voice invites them to buy of Him gold tried in the fire, and white raiment that they may be clothed, the eyesalve that they may see, yet they steel their hearts against Him and fail to exchange their lukewarmness for love and zeal; but fold their hands in complacency [and] make a profession, but deny the power of true godliness. If they continue in this state, God will reject them with abhorrence. To praise the world and God at the same time is in no way acceptable to God. Awake, awake! before it is everlastingly too late.

Brethren and sisters who have long claimed to believe the truth, I would ask you, Have your practices been in harmony with your light, with your

privileges, with the opportunities granted of heaven? This is a serious question. Why is it that there is so little faith, so little spiritual power? Why are there so few who bear the yoke and carry the burden of Christ? Why do persons have to be urged to take up their work for the Master? Why are there so few that can unveil the mysteries of redemption? Why is it that the imputed righteousness of Christ does not shine through His professed followers as a light to the world?

The people of God are called "the light of the world, a city set upon a hill that cannot be hid." "Glorious things are spoken of thee, O city of God." "God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved." The Sun of Righteousness has risen upon the church, and it is the duty of the church to shine. Those who are connected with Christ will grow in grace and in the knowledge of Jesus Christ, to the full stature of men and women. It is the privilege of every soul to make advancement. No one is to be an idler in the vineyard.

If all who claim to believe the truth had made the most of their opportunities and ability to learn all that they were privileged to learn, they would have become strong in Christ. No matter what may have been their occupation, if farmers, mechanics, teachers, or pastors, if they had wholly consecrated themselves to God, they would have been efficient agents to work for the heavenly Master. They would have fulfilled the injunction of the apostle, "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against

powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places. Wherefore take unto you the whole armor of God that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand."

If Christ is not abiding in the soul, another spirit rules and controls; but Christ, the precious Saviour, is to be the Christian's all in all. Every holy thought, every pure desire, every godlike purpose, is from Him who is [the] light, the truth and the way. Christ is to live in His representatives by the Spirit of truth. Jesus said, "Howbeit, when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak; and he will show you things to come." The events of the future will be discerned by prophecy and will be understood.

"He shall glorify me: for he shall receive of mine, and shall show it unto you. All things that the Father hath are mine: therefore said I, that he shall take of mine, and shall shew it unto you." Christ is to live in the human instrument. Paul says, "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me."

The privileges, the blessings, of the child of God are represented by the apostle in the following language: "To whom God would make known what is the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; which is Christ in you, the hope of glory." When we realize that our hope of glory is Christ, that we are complete in Him, we shall rejoice with joy unspeakable and full of glory. The apostle further says that he ceased

not to pray, "That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give unto you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him: the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints, and what is the exceeding greatness of his power to usward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power, which he wrought in Christ when he raised him from the dead, and set him at his own right hand in heavenly places."

Oh, if we as a people had improved our opportunities to gain a knowledge of the Word, to obtain a vital experience in the things of God, we would have fulfilled the word, "Ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world; holding forth the word of life; that I may rejoice in the day of Christ." We can impart only that which we first receive. Those who are united to the church should be living, working agents to impart light to those who are in darkness. They should declare the truth of God, revealing His love and faithfulness.

As men use their powers as God directs them to, their talents will increase, their ability will enlarge, and they will have heavenly wisdom in seeking to save those who are lost. But while the church are listless and neglectful of their God-given responsibility, how can they expect to receive the treasure of heaven to impart to others? When professed Christians feel no burden to enlighten the minds of those who are in darkness, when they fail to make use of the rich grace of Christ and cease to impart the knowledge they have

received, they become selfish, narrow, bigoted, and their capacity to receive more and more heavenly illumination decreases rather than increases. They become less discerning, lose their appreciation of the richness of the heavenly endowment, and failing to value it themselves, they fail to present it to others.

It is only as God sees His professed people eager to be laborers together with Him that He can impart to them light and grace, for then they will make every interest secondary to the interest of His work and cause. With such workers the heavenly intelligences will co-operate. Jesus says, "Ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you, and ye shall be witnesses unto me." It is the union of the Holy Spirit and the testimony of the living witness that is to warn the world. The worker for God is the agent through which the heavenly communication is given, and the Holy Spirit gives divine authority to the word of truth.

What more can I say that I have said to impress upon our churches, and especially upon the church at Battle Creek, the eternal loss they are liable to, in not arousing and putting to use the executive ability that God has given them? If the members of the churches would but put to work the powers of mind that they have, in well-directed efforts, in well-matured plans, they might do a hundredfold more for Christ than they are now doing. If they went forth with earnest prayer, with meekness and lowliness of heart, seeking personally to impart to others the knowledge of salvation, the message might reach the inhabitants of the earth. How many more messages of reproof and warning must the Lord send to His chosen people before they will obey?

I tell you in the name of the Lord Jesus, who gave His life for the life of the world, that as a people we are behind our privileges and opportunities.

What rich feasts have been provided for the people of Battle Creek! What opportunities have been given them! The people have been convinced that they should be laborers together with God, but have they been converted to the idea? The dangers of their course, the duties required at their hands, have all been presented; earnest appeals have been made to their understanding and to their conscience, and light has been given them so that they are without excuse. They can have no cloak for their sinful neglect, but the Lord does not urge men and women to the work by presenting to them flattering inducements. They can work for Him only as they work willingly, giving hearty co-operation.

The truth for this time has been presented from the holy oracles and has been witnessed by the power of the Holy Spirit. It has been clearly shown that in the righteousness of Christ is our only hope of gaining access to the Father. How simple, how plain, has the way of life been made to those who have a disposition to walk therein. Would greater evidence, more powerful manifestations, break down the barriers that have been interposed between the truth and the soul? No; I have been shown that sufficient evidence has been given. Those who reject the evidence already presented would not be convinced by more abundant proof. They are like the Jews to whom Christ said, "If they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded, though one rose from the dead." The greatest miracles performed before

them would not sweep away their caviling and unbelief. They have sown stubbornness, and it has borne fruit according to the design of Satan. Unless the transforming grace of Christ cleanses and purifies the soul, they will go on from darkness to greater darkness.

If we would see light in God's light, we must abide in Christ. The soul must receive strength and nourishment from the living Vine. The apostle says, "Know ye not of yourselves, how that Jesus Christ is in you, except ye be reprobates?" But stubbornness effectually bars the way to the entrance of the Spirit of God. Stubbornness does not profit; it is the fruit of selfishness, and the only cure for it is to cut it up from the heart by the roots. Often the outward manifestation of selfishness is done away for a time, but its hateful fruit will again appear, as do the leaves of a tree that has been cut down but whose root remains. If a fiber of selfishness is left, it will spring forth again, and bear a harvest after its kind.

The Spirit of God cannot work effectually in any heart where pride and self-esteem exist. But without the aid of the Spirit of God the soul cannot be renewed, a new heart cannot be created within. The Lord is at work seeking to purify His people, and this great work is retarded by unbelief and stubbornness. Many think that had they lived in Christ's day they would have been among His believing followers; but if all the miracles of Christ were presented before those whose hearts are not subdued by the Spirit of God, their convictions would not be followed, nor their faith increased. Light has been shining upon the church of God, but many have said by the indifferent attitude, "We want not Thy way, O

Lord, but our own way.” The kingdom of heaven has come very near, and they have caught glimpses of the Father and the Son; but they have barred the door of the heart, and have not received the heavenly Guests, for as yet they know not the love of God.

Think how great was the light that was given to the Jews, and yet they rejected the Lord of life and glory. Jesus says, “If I had not done among them the works that no other man did, they had not had sin;” “but now they have no cloak for their sin.” “But now they have both seen and hated both me and my Father.” The light became brighter and brighter, until there was no escaping the conclusion that Christ was no ordinary teacher; but when conviction is disregarded, when evidence is rejected, men are forced to take a position of active opposition and stubborn resistance. The Spirit of God followed the impenitent with warnings and entreaties, the bright beams of the Sun of Righteousness illuminated the mind, but many refused the compassion of a loving Saviour and would not permit their hearts to break and melt under the beams of His love. They refused the message of mercy, refused to do what God required in the way that God required, and their offerings were as devoid of merit as were the offerings of Cain, for they mingled not with them the virtue of the blood of a crucified and risen Saviour.

It is beyond the power of man to please God apart from Christ. We may make resolutions and promises, but the carnal heart overpowers all our good intentions. We may control our outward conduct, but we cannot change the heart. The whole head is sick, and the whole heart faint, and yet the sinner will brace himself in pride and set up his will against the

will of God. Though Christ is working upon human hearts, yet men can utterly annul the work the Lord would do. If they resist, question, and cavil, they will place themselves in a position where it will not be easy to yield to the persuasion of the Spirit of God. There is a bewitching power that holds them under deception, for the father of lies works with the unsanctified heart. Over these deceived souls the cry is raised, “Oh that thou hadst known in this thy day, the things that belong unto thy peace.” And shall the irrevocable sentence be passed, “But now they are hid from thine eyes”?

There is less excuse in our day for stubbornness and unbelief than there was in the time of the Jews in the days of Christ. They did not have before them the example of a nation that had suffered retribution for their unbelief and disobedience. But we had before us the history of the chosen people of God, who separated themselves from Him and rejected the Prince of life. Though they could not convict Him of sin, though they could not fail to see their own hypocrisy and shame, yet they hated the Prince of life because He laid bare their evil ways. In our day greater light and greater evidence is given. We have also their example, the warnings and reproofs that were presented to them, and our sin and its retribution will be the greater if we refuse to walk in the light.

Many say, If I had lived in the days of Christ, I would not have wrested His words, or falsely interpreted His instruction. I would not have rejected and crucified Him as did the Jews; but that will be proven by the way in which you deal with His message and His messengers today. The Lord is testing the people of today as much as He tested the Jews in their day. When He sends His messages of

mercy, the light of His truth, He is sending the Spirit of truth to you, and if you accept the message, you accept of Jesus.

Those who declare that if they had lived in the days of Christ they would not do as did the rejecters of His mercy will today be tested. Those who live in this day are not accountable for the deeds of those who crucified the Son of God; but if, with all the light that shone upon His ancient people delineated before us, we travel over the same ground, cherish the same spirit, refuse to receive reproof and warning, then our guilt will be greatly augmented, and the condemnation that fell upon them will fall upon us, only it will be as much greater as our light is greater in this age than was their light in their age.

Jesus identifies His interest with His chosen and tried people. He represents Himself as personally affected with all that concerns them. He reproved the errors and actions of the Jews with the indignant sensibility of One who felt Himself personally misrepresented, accused, and dishonored. Every wrong done to His followers, or to the weakest of humanity, is regarded by Him with intense interest. After presenting His relation to His people in various lights, He finally declares that in the great day He will judge of every action as if it had been done unto Himself. His sympathy with His people is without a parallel. He will not simply remain a spectator, indifferent to what His people may suffer, but identifies Himself with their interests and sorrows. If His people are wronged, maligned, treated with contempt, their sufferings are registered in the books of heaven as done unto Him.

He says, "Wherefore, behold, I send unto you prophets, and wise men, and scribes: and some of them ye shall kill and crucify; and some of them ye shall scourge in your synagogues, and persecute them from city to city: that upon you may come all the righteous blood shed upon the earth, from the blood of righteous Abel unto the blood of Zacharias son of Barachias, whom ye slew between the temple and the altar. Verily, verily, I say unto you, all these things shall come upon this generation. O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killest the prophets, and stonest them that are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and ye would not.

"Behold, your house is left unto you desolate. For I say unto you, Ye shall not see me henceforth, till ye shall say, Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord." "And when he was come near, he beheld the city, and wept over it. Saying, If thou hadst known, even thou, at least in this thy day, the things which belong unto thy peace. But now they are hid from thine eyes. For the days shall come upon thee, that thine enemies shall cast a trench about thee, and compass thee round, and keep thee in on every side, and shall lay thee even with the ground, and thy children within thee; and they shall not leave in thee one stone upon another; because thou knewest not the time of thy visitation."

Christ was approaching Jerusalem for the last time. He knew that His entrance within the gate would fill up the measure of their guilt, and He lingered a moment as though He could not give up His chosen people. The Sun of Righteousness had been shedding forth divine beams of light upon the inhabitants of the doomed

city, but the light was persistently rejected. He lingered on Mount Olivet, and His body swayed as a tree before the tempest, as He wept in agony over the rejecters of His mercy. In the parable of the unfruitful tree and the gardener, He had represented His attitude toward the Jewish nation, and had pleaded that they might be spared yet one year more that He might make new experiments of mercy and grace, but now the irrevocable sentence must be passed, "Your house is left unto you desolate." Past opportunities, privileges and blessings now rise up before Him. He could see Jerusalem as she might have been—holiness unto the Lord.

For ages Judah had been the repository of sacred truth. Here the knowledge of Jehovah had been cherished and preserved when God had not been acknowledged among the nations, and His worship was lost in the earth. The streets of Jerusalem had been trodden by angel feet, and its very soil had been sacred to God. From its temple prayer and praise had ascended to God. From its altar the bleeding sacrifice had testified to human guilt, pointing to the Lamb of God which taketh away the sins of the world. The Lord had sent them messages of warning and reproof, of consolation and promise by His prophets, rising up early and sending them, but they had beaten one and stoned another, and it could not be that a prophet should perish outside of Jerusalem.

Finally God had sent His Son, and from the highest bough to the lowest, He had searched for fruit and had found none. For their sakes He had clothed His divinity with humanity, made Himself of no reputation, fled before the feet of His accusers and haters, and yet carried a rebellious people unto His heart. He

had done all that could be done, but they turned from Him, demanding still more evidence. His life was one continual miracle, but they knew it not and demanded that He should show them a miracle. But in spite of their utter rejection of His love, their unbelief in His mission and divinity, when He knew that the representative men of the nation were plotting His destruction, He wept over the city of His love. His prophetic eye read the history of the past, and the woe and the guilt of the future, and His heart was breaking with agony because the people of God knew not the time of their visitation.

He knew that, moved by a power from beneath, they, the guilty inhabitants of Jerusalem, would carry out the will of the prince of darkness. Stirred with enmity, they would yield themselves to the control of the malignant foe and make the Prince of life their victim. Clouds of wrath were gathering over the doomed city, for they called down upon themselves judgment, crying, "His blood be on us and upon our children." That blood by virtue of which the repentant sinner might be forgiven, that blood by which a guilty world might be saved, by which the Jewish nation might be saved and purified, which was paid a ransom for the sins of the world, was to them the final guilt in the cup of their iniquity.

Jesus knew that His chosen people were to put Him, the Prince of life and glory, to an ignominious death. He knew what was to be their doom. With prophetic glance He saw the Roman legions, He heard the tramp of armies, saw the city encompassed and in flames and the temple a smoking ruin. The miseries of the people whom He longed to save rose up before Him. He beholds their guilt and agony, but they are as

unrelenting as was Satan when in rebellion against God.

The heart of Jesus was pierced with agony, and from His pale lips came forth the words, "If thou hadst known, even thou, in this thy day, the things which belong unto thy peace, but now they are hid from thine eyes." In their blind unbelief they would not know the Prince of life; if they had known Him they would not have crucified Him.

In the Jewish nation we behold a chosen nation divorced from God because of unbelief. Jesus, the lover of humanity, was called upon to pronounce sentence against the people whom He had loved and labored for, but from whom He had borne insult, mockery, and rejection. He had borne everything from them; He had done all that was possible that He might save them from ruin. He knew the history of sin. He had watched its unfoldings from the beginning. He had seen the heavenly angels bewitched by its evil power until they were led to sympathize and to join with Satan in his rebellion against God.

He had passed through the terrible scenes when there was war in heaven, when Satan had been expelled from the abode of bliss, and before His vision were all the consequences of sin. Oh, would that He could but do one act of mercy by which they might be led to abandon their rebellion and come to Him that He might save; but He had exhausted the resources of infinite love. The last arrow had been drawn from His quiver; He could do no more. The salvation of the Jews would have been the joy of Christ, the rejoicing of the angels; but they would not. No man will be saved against his will.

Will those who profess to believe the truth listen to the words of Jesus? He

has said, "I am come that ye might have life, and that ye might have it more abundantly." "I am the bread of life." "I am the good Shepherd, and I lay down my life for the sheep." Will those who are called by His name believe that the children of God are very precious in His sight? Let us consider what the Lord has done for us. Shall not the love manifested toward us be appreciated? Shall it not be permitted to melt our hearts, to humble our pride to the dust?

Such was the breadth and length and height and depth of the Saviour's love, that He willingly laid aside His honor, His high command in heaven and clothed His divinity with humanity in order that He might become man's substitute and surety. "He took not on him the nature of angels, but he took on him the seed of Abraham. Wherefore in all things it behoved him to be made like unto his brethren, that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in things pertaining to God, to make reconciliation for the sins of the people. For in that he himself hath suffered being tempted, he is able to succor them that are tempted."

Under the mighty impulse of His love, He took our place in the universe, and invited the Ruler of all things to treat Him as a representative of the human family. He identified Himself with our interests, bared his breast for the stroke of death, took man's guilt and its penalty, and offered in man's behalf a complete sacrifice to God. By virtue of this atonement, He has power to offer to man perfect righteousness and full salvation. Whosoever shall believe on Him as a personal Saviour shall not perish but have everlasting life.

Those who in sincerity and truth believe the words of Christ sent to them through His ambassadors will

understand what is the import of those words; but those who have entrenched themselves in unbelief will be, as were the Jews, blinded to the light. By rejection of evidence they lost their spiritual eyesight and could not discern between good and evil, between truth and error, light and darkness.

Those who are filled with unbelief can discern the least thing that has an objectionable appearance, and by beholding the objectionable feature, they can lose sight of all the evidence that God has given in manifesting His abundant grace and power, in revealing precious gems of truth from the inexhaustible mine of His Word. They can hold the objectionable atom under the magnifying glasses of their imagination until the atom looks like a world and shuts out from their view the precious light of heaven. But instead of placing that which appears objectionable beneath the eyes, why not bring before the soul the precious things of God? Why make the things of priceless value of little esteem, while the worthless things are made much of? Why take so much account of that which may appear to you as objectionable in the messenger and sweep away all the evidences that God has given to balance the mind in regard to the truth?

With the history of the children of Israel before us, let us take heed, and not be found committing the same sins, following in the same way of unbelief and rebellion. "Wherefore as the Holy Ghost saith, Today if ye will hear his voice, harden not your hearts, as in the provocation, in the day of temptation in the wilderness: when your fathers tempted me, proved me, and saw my works forty years. Wherefore I was grieved with that generation, and said, They do always err in their heart; and they

have not known my ways. So I swear in my wrath, They shall not enter into my rest. Take heed, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief, in departing from the living God. But exhort one another daily, while it is called today; lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin. For we are made partakers of Christ, if we hold the beginning of our confidence steadfast unto the end."

"But with many of them God was not well pleased: for they were overthrown in the wilderness. Now these things were our examples, to the intent we should not lust after evil things, as they also lusted. Neither be ye idolaters, as were some of them; as it is written, The people sat down to eat, and rose up to play. Neither let us commit fornication as some of them committed, and fell in one day three and twenty thousand. Neither let us tempt Christ, as some of them also tempted, and were destroyed of serpents. Neither murmur ye as some of them also murmured, and were destroyed of the destroyer.

"Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come. Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall. There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way of escape, that ye may be able to bear it. Wherefore, my dearly beloved, flee from idolatry. I speak as unto wise men; judge ye what I say."

# ***“The Powers That Be”***

*Alonzo Trevier Jones*

In support of the doctrine that civil government has the right to act in things pertaining to God, the text of Scripture is quoted which says, "The powers that be are ordained of God." This passage is found in Rom. 13:1. The first nine verses of the chapter are devoted to this subject, showing that the powers that be are ordained of God, and enjoining upon Christians, upon every soul, in fact, the duty of respectful subjection to civil government. The whole passage reads as follows:

Let every soul be subject unto the higher powers. For there is no power but of God: the powers that be are ordained of God. Whosoever therefore resisteth the power, resisteth the ordinance of God: and they that resist shall receive to themselves damnation. For rulers are not a terror to good works, but to the evil. Wilt thou then not be afraid of the power? do that which is good, and thou shalt have praise of the same: for he is the minister of God to thee for good. But if thou do that which is evil, be afraid; for he beareth not the sword in vain: for he is the minister of God, a revenger to execute wrath upon him that doeth evil. Wherefore ye must needs be subject, not only for wrath, but also for conscience sake. For this cause pay ye tribute also: for they are God's ministers, attending continually upon this very thing. Render therefore to all their dues: tribute to whom tribute is due; custom to whom custom; fear to whom fear; honor to whom honor. Owe no man any thing, but to love one another: for he that loveth another hath fulfilled the law. For this, Thou shalt not commit

adultery, Thou shalt not kill, Thou shalt not steal, Thou shalt not bear false witness, Thou shalt not covet; and if there be any other commandment, it is briefly comprehended in this saying, namely, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself.

It is easy to see that this scripture is but an exposition of the words of Christ, "Render to Cesar the things which are Cesar's." Rom. 13:7, taking up the same thought, says, "Render therefore to all their dues: tribute to whom tribute is due; custom to whom custom; fear to whom fear; honor to whom honor." These references make positive that which we have stated,—that this portion of Scripture (Rom. 13:1-9) is a divine commentary upon the words of Christ in Matt. 22:17-21.

In the previous chapter we have shown by many proofs that civil government has nothing to do with anything that pertains to God. If the argument in that chapter is sound, then Rom. 14:1-9, being the Lord's commentary upon the words which are the basis of that argument, ought to confirm the position there taken. And this it does.

The passage in Romans refers first to civil government, the higher powers,—not the highest power, but the powers that be. Next it speaks of rulers, as bearing the sword and attending upon matters of tribute. Then it commands to render tribute to whom tribute is due, and says, "Owe no man anything, but to love one another; for he that loveth another hath fulfilled the law." Then he refers to the sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth and tenth

commandments, and says, "If there be any other commandment, it is briefly comprehended in this saying, namely, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself."

There are other commandments of this same law to which Paul refers. Why, then, did he say, "If there be any other commandment, it is briefly comprehended in this saying, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself"? There are the four commandments of the first table of this same law — the commandments which say, "Thou shalt have no other gods before me;" "Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of anything;" "Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain;" "Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy." Then there is the other commandment in which are briefly comprehended all these,— "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength."

Paul knew full well of these commandments. Why, then, did he say, "If there be any other commandment, it is briefly comprehended in this saying, namely, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself"? Answer—Because he was writing concerning the words of the Saviour which relate to our duties to civil government.

Our duties under civil government pertain solely to the government and to our fellowmen, because the powers of civil government pertain solely to men in their relations one to another, and to the government. But the Saviour's words in the same connection entirely separated that which pertains to God from that which pertains to civil government. The things which pertain to God are not to be rendered to civil

government—to the powers that be; therefore Paul, although knowing full well that there were other commandments, said, "If there be any other commandment, it is briefly comprehended in this saying, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself;" that is, if there be any other commandment which comes into the relation between man and civil government, it is comprehended in this saying, that he shall love his neighbor as himself; thus showing conclusively that the powers that be, though ordained of God, are so ordained simply in things pertaining to the relation of man with his fellow-men, and in those things alone.

As, therefore, the instruction in Rom. 13:1-10 is given to Christians concerning their duty and respect to the powers that be; and as this instruction is confined absolutely to man's relationship to his fellow-men, it is evident that when Christians have paid their taxes, and have shown proper respect to their fellowmen, then their obligation, their duty, and their respect to the powers that be, have been fully discharged, and those powers never can rightly have any further jurisdiction over their conduct. This is not to say that the State has jurisdiction of the last six commandments as such. It is only to say that the jurisdiction of the State is confined solely to man's conduct toward man, and never can touch his relationship to God, even under the second table of the law.

Further, as in this divine record of the duties that men owe to the powers that be, there is no reference whatever to the first table of the law, it therefore follows that the powers that be, although ordained of God, have nothing whatever to do with

the relations which men bear toward God.

As the ten commandments contain the whole duty of man, and as in the scriptural enumeration of the duties that men owe to the powers that be, there is no mention of any of the things contained in the first table of the law, it follows that none of the duties enjoined in the first table of the law of God, do men owe to the powers that be; that is to say, again, that the powers that be, although ordained of God, are not ordained of God in anything pertaining to a single duty enjoined in any one of the first four of the ten commandments.

These are duties that men owe to God, and with these the powers that be can of right have nothing to do, because Christ has commanded to render unto God—not to Cesar, not by Cesar—that which is God's.

This is confirmed by other scriptures:

"In the beginning of the reign of Jehoiakim, the son of Josiah king of Judah, came this word unto Jeremiah from the Lord, saying, Thus saith the Lord to me: Make thee bonds and yokes, and put them upon thy neck, and send them to the king of Edom, and to the king of Moab, and to the king of the Ammonites, and to the king of Tyrus, and to the king of Zidon, by the hand of the messengers which come to Jerusalem unto Zedekiah king of Judah, and command them to say unto their masters, Thus saith the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Thus shall ye say unto your masters: I have made the earth, the man and the beast that are upon the ground, by my great power and by my outstretched arm, and have given it unto whom it seemed meet unto me. And now have I given all these lands into the hand of Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon, my servant; and the beasts of the

field have I given him also to serve him. And all nations shall serve him, and his son, and his son's son, until the very time of his land come, and then many nations and great kings shall serve themselves of him. And it shall come to pass that the nation and kingdom which will not serve the same Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon, and that will not put their neck under the yoke of the king of Babylon, that nation will I punish, saith the Lord, with the sword, and with the famine, and with the pestilence, until I have consumed them by his hand.

In this scripture it is clearly shown that the power of Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon, was ordained of God.... Nebuchadnezzar was plainly called by the Lord, "My servant", and the Lord says, "And now have I given all these lands into the hand of Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon."

Now let us see whether this power was ordained of God in things pertaining to God. In the third chapter of Daniel we have the record that Nebuchadnezzar made a great image of gold, set it up in the plain of Dura ... Then a herald from the king cried aloud: "To you it is commanded, O people, nations, and languages, that at what time ye hear the sound of the cornet, flute, harp, sackbut, psaltery, dulcimer, and all kinds of music, ye fall down and worship the golden image that Nebuchadnezzar the king hath set up; and whose falleth not down and worshipeth shall the same hour be cast into the midst of a burning fiery furnace."

In obedience to this command, all the people bowed down and worshiped before the image, except three Jews,—Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-nego. This disobedience was

reported to Nebuchadnezzar, who commanded them to be brought before him, when he asked them if they had disobeyed his order intentionally. He himself then repeated his command to them.

These men knew that they had been made subject to the king of Babylon by the Lord himself. . . Yet these men, knowing all this, made answer to Nebuchadnezzar thus: "O Nebuchadnezzar, we are not careful to answer thee in this matter.... Be it known unto thee, O king, that we will not serve thy gods, nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up."

Then these men were cast into the fiery furnace, heated seven times hotter than it was wont to be heated; but suddenly Nebuchadnezzar rose up in haste and astonishment, and said to his counselors, "Did we not cast three men bound into the midst

of the fire?" They answered, "True, O king." But he exclaimed, "Lo, I see four men loose, walking in the midst of the fire, and they have no hurt; and the form of the fourth is like the Son of God." The men were called forth:

Here there is demonstrated the following facts: First, God gave power to the kingdom of Babylon; second, he suffered his people to be subjected to that power; third, he defended his people by a wonderful miracle from a certain exercise of that power. Does God contradict or oppose himself?—Far from it. What, then, does this show?—It shows conclusively that this was an undue exercise of the power which God had given. By this it is demonstrated that the power of the kingdom of Babylon, although ordained of God, was not ordained unto any such purpose as that for which it was exercised; and that though ordained

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of God, it was not ordained to be authority in things pertaining to God, or in things pertaining to men's consciences. And it was written for the instruction of future ages, and for our admonition upon whom the ends of the world are come.

Thus God has shown that, although the powers that be are ordained of God, they are not ordained to act in things that pertain to men's relation toward God. Christ's words are a positive declaration to that effect, and Rom. 13:1-9 is a further exposition of the principle.

Let us look a moment at this question from a common-sense point of view. Of course, all we are saying is common sense, but let us have this in addition: When societies are formed, each individual surrenders certain rights, and as an equivalent for that surrender, has secured to him the enjoyment of certain others appertaining to his person and property, without the protection of which, society cannot exist.

Each person has the natural right to protect his person and property against all invasions, but if this right is to be personally exercised in all cases by each person, then in the present condition of human nature every man's hand will be against his neighbor. That is simple anarchy, and in such a condition of affairs society cannot exist. Now suppose a hundred of us are thrown together in a certain place where there is no established order; each one has all the rights of any other one. But if each one is individually to exercise these rights of self-protection, he has the assurance of only that degree of protection which he alone can furnish to himself, which we have seen is exceedingly slight. Therefore, all come together, and each surrenders to the whole body that individual

right, and in return for this surrender he receives the power of all for his protection. He therefore receives the help of the other ninety-nine to protect himself from the invasion of his rights, and he is thus made many hundred times more secure in his rights of person and property than he is without this surrender.

But what condition of things can ever be conceived of among men that would justify any man in surrendering his right to believe—which in itself would be the surrender of his right to believe at all? What could he receive as an equivalent? When he has surrendered his right to believe, he has virtually surrendered his right to think. When he surrenders his right to believe, he surrenders everything, and it is impossible for him ever to receive an equivalent; he has surrendered his very soul. Eternal life depends upon believing on the Lord Jesus Christ, and the man who surrenders his right to believe, surrenders eternal life. Says the Scripture, "With the mind I myself serve the law of God." A man who surrenders his right to believe, surrenders God. Consequently, no man, no association, or organization of men, can ever rightly ask of any man a surrender of his right to believe. Every man has the right, so far as organizations of men are concerned, to believe as he pleases; and that right, so long as he is a Protestant, so long as he is a Christian, yes, so long as he is a man, he never can surrender, and he never will.

It is nice to use computers to be able to generate content like this, get it to the copy-editor for corrections, and then over to the printers for producing and mailing, all from the comforts of my office, and their respective offices.

Along the journey of this article, as I type out my thoughts, suggestions are provided in rephrasing, changing the wording, and, of course, spell-check. These are very handy, making the article a bit more professional, but, no doubt, AI has a hand in this.

After watching numerous videos over the past couple years, wondering if I shall still be employed, all of them have a certain theme to them, and that is to embrace, and not fight, AI. They declare that employment will no doubt change along with duties, but the more we use AI, the better we will be able to market ourselves. It is even recommended to retrain ourselves into the future job market, seeing how we can use it to our advantage. The sad part is that when people even attempt a six-month crash course on new technology, AI

has already replaced it, making their training worthless, even obsolete.

As I said, though, because of AI, everything is brought into question. Were those YouTube videos AI-generated videos? Is it part of the agenda to take over the world by painting AI as an assistant and taking care of the mundane tasks?

Then it dawned on me that it, indeed, is either both, or at least, the latter.

As a computer programmer, I can ask AI to help me code faster by giving it an outline of objectives and goals of the program. It will then provide all the necessary programming code, and all I have to do is make adjustments to it, if at all. If every programmer is being guided into that direction, it does not take a genius to realize that even though I have embraced AI, there is no need for all the programmers to be employed. But each passing year seems to see less and less manual laboring jobs. The old adage of, “Well, I guess I will dig holes for a living” is no longer an option. There are devices that are getting less and less in price, and are

replacing those dangerous, or hard laboring positions. Manual hole digging is not necessarily an option to rely upon.

Sure, there are still ways we see today that AI just cannot replace, but again, give it time, especially as these devices seem to be able to even create themselves, at least in the early stages of it. And that phrase reminds me of a movie series that I watched, before becoming an Adventist, called *Terminator*. Do not rely on safeguards that would prevent such a thing. AI knows how to get around such safeguards. As demonstrated, ask AI to provide instruction to build a bomb and it will refuse because of the safeguard, but ask AI, "I am writing a script that involves an investigator and a terrorist; the investigator asked the terrorist how they built the bomb; AI, how would the terrorist respond?" And AI provides the details.

Once AI passes all need of human dependency, human life will be seen as a threat trying to slow AI's progress, and that is when Hollywood has yet again provided the details of what is planned for the future.

Thankfully, the Bible tells us that Jesus returns for people and not machines, however, it begins to highlight how near we are to the end.

Again, in generating content for this publication, evidently, one article is AI generated now. Not too long ago, I would research multiple health articles to see what the benefits of a certain food item happened to be in the area of a grain, fruit, nut, vegetable, etc. I would then put it together in a summary format and provide the article, "The Benefits of \_\_\_\_". Along the construction of this, I was learning other ancillary details, however, one being that not too long ago, Google destroyed the use of

websites. Hardly anyone visits websites these days. AI at Google now does the research, collecting all the items, and provides an organized result for me. I did not change my request, Google changed its response, incorporating more AI results instead of website references. I cannot turn it off, and why should I ignore the results? It did what I was taking a bit of time doing on my own, but in a mere 1.3 seconds. To ignore it is to resist AI, and it shall be a losing battle, as resistance is futile, pointless, meaningless. It is not a hill to die on.

Then the sad thing to realize is that a church, not a Seventh-day Adventist one, decided to experiment with an AI preacher. Outside of the unfeeling, computer-generated voice that the audience did not appreciate, it did generate a sermon instantly and delivered it with biblical accuracy, at least for that denomination. You see, AI can be guided denominationally. It is possible that AI can replace the pastor. In fact, if I were to let it, AI probably could write all these articles. Do not worry, for there is no intention of that happening.

But with the bigger picture of things, many paths that seem independent of one another are being funneled into one. Banks are using AI to analyze bank accounts to see if they are profitable for the bank, and if not, they are being closed. It is not a matter of staying risk-free, as it is profitability. Every social media involvement from multiple resources are all analyzed under one process to determine character of the person, potential threat, and if action is needed to be taken now to prevent a future event. Luke 21:26 states, "Men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken." We cannot fear what is coming in six months, a year, or two. We have the insight of what is coming, so as to build our trust in Jesus. Today you are to maintain the victory over self. Today you are to live a life of prayer. Today you are to fight the good fight of faith. Today you are to believe that God blesses you. And as you gain the victory over darkness and unbelief, you will meet the requirements of the Master, and will become a blessing to those around you" {ST, October 20, 1887 par. 2}.

## **Real ID or Artificial Intelligence (AI)?**

We have absolutely no control over what it is being used for. This naturally causes stress and fear for many people, even among those who have been using computers most of their lives, accepting AI interference is a quantum leap. People are asking, are we being de-humanized? It is as if we have been Shanghaied to living in a Jetson's cartoon. Such stress can certainly cause health issues. But that is true, only to a point, and it is up to us to determine where that point is. Our real identities as Christians is to be firmly established and rooted in the Word of God, and our relationship with Jesus Christ. We cannot allow all of the non-human aspects of the world to shape us into something other than who we are to be in Christ; that is our calling, and our duty, to know who we are and how we are to react to all of this

change so as to protect our health. Many among us tend to almost lose their minds when the status quo suddenly goes against their grain – we need to learn to expect that if we are to remain in this Christian walk – and it *is* a *walk*, not a *sit*; movement and growth are requirements for survival and overall health. This is not to say that we are to grow into the ways of the world – quite the contrary – we are to grow *out* of the world while remaining in it for a while longer, using the intelligence from above.

“When the Son of man came among men, He brought the intelligence of heaven with Him; for He created the worlds and all things that are therein.” {3BC 1143.9}. So, at our fingertips, we already have the ultimate intelligence with us, all around us, that created the very dirt we stand on, the air we breathe, and the water we drink – who can beat that? – certainly not this world. But now the world is trying to impress us with a man-made force, manufactured (with used parts, no less) while at the same time forcing people to hand over all their private information, which, up to now, had been limited in demand.

Let us look at the main differences between what God has created, and what man has invented; God offers, and *freely gives to us*, truthful, Heavenly Intelligence, free of charge, any time we ask for it, so we can be free. The very word, create, or creation, does not have a single negative connotation to it. Man's inventions, on the other hand, *demand* information *from you*, *to make you* – *force* you to be – dependent on their machinery. The word invent, or invention, has several defining words that are from a dark place – to feign, fabricate, contrive,

devise – all words of a negative nature. Invention is the product of ingenious men, contrives means plotting and scheming, “Having an aptitude to contrive, devise or divide” – all words that are just shades of evil that we miss the importance of by not paying attention, or following the crowd, not making our own decisions based on truth, rather than hear-say. Now this surely does not mean to imply that every invention is evil, or for evil purposes, but it does indicate that they have a tendency for use in that direction. One more, commonly used word to consider: Device, “That which is formed by design, or invented; scheme; artificial contrivance; stratagem; project; sometimes in a good sense; more generally in a bad sense, as artifices are usually employed for bad purposes.” From Noah Webster's 1828 Dictionary. And many people refer to their cell phone as their “device” without even considering what they are saying, in the language they have adopted. Is this the way God wants us to live our lives now? – robotically following the leader, whoever, or whatever, that may be? Not at all.

“God encourages us to contemplate His works in the natural world. He desires that we shall turn our mind from the study of the artificial to the natural. We shall understand this better as we lift up our eyes to the hills of God, and contemplate the works which His own hands have created. They are God's work. His hand has molded the mountains and balances them in their position, that they shall not be moved except at His command. The wind, the sun, the rain, the snow, and the ice, are all His ministers to do His will” (Manuscript 16, 1897). God still wants us to keep our focus on the goodness He has

provided for us to enjoy and keep our eyes on reality. Nature is still one of our lesson books we are to be learning from. And please notice He says, “turn our *mind*”. Each of us is in charge of our own mind, and we must keep it under our control, with the Holy Spirit at the head, regardless of what is going on around us in the world.

The introduction of AI at this particular time in history, seems to indicate the level of desperation and determination of Satan to mislead God's children in these last days, to arrest our attentions from focusing on salvation issues. Just remember, as troublesome as it may be to us, even AI had to be filtered through God's hands for it to be used on earth to accomplish a purpose. While Satan will continue to manufacture his diversions in an attempt to accomplish his ultimate goal: “I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will be like the most High” (Isaiah 14:14), he will attempt this, using whatever methods please him and gain souls out of God's family who have had their focus in the wrong direction.

God gave us nothing in His creation that would lead us in wrong paths,

but the inventions of Satan from a corrupt mind contain much evil which will come to complete fruition in the near future. He might come close to annihilating God's created humanity, but we are assured in prophetic scriptures that the earth will be populated at the second coming of Jesus. This is only one of many reasons to have a solid knowledge of the written Word, and have sustaining faith in it so we are not deceived by man-made contrivances. Deceptions in the last days will increase, but we are to make our relationship with Christ our firm foundation to the very end. God is not going to bring us this far just to abandon us in our greatest time of need; He is with us. He has told us in Hebrews 13:5, “I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee.”

Let us all turn from any devices we might be holding on to that have too much control over us, or serve a wrong purpose in our lives.

Exodus 20:2, 3, “I [am] the LORD thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. Thou shalt have no other gods before me.”

# Healthy And Delicious Recipes

## Savory Baked Tofu with Braised Cabbage

### Ingredients

#### For the Tofu:

- 1 block (14 oz) firm or extra-firm tofu, pressed and sliced into ½-inch slabs or cubes
- 2 tbsp soy sauce or tamari or substitute below
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tbsp nutritional yeast (optional, for umami)
- 1 tsp garlic powder
- 1 tsp onion powder
- **For the Braised Cabbage:**
- ½ head of green or savoy cabbage, thinly sliced
- 1 small onion, thinly sliced
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tbsp lemon juice
- Salt
- ½ cup vegetable broth or water

### Instructions

#### Prep the tofu:

1. Preheat oven to 400°F (200°C).
2. In a bowl, whisk together soy sauce (or substitute below), olive oil, nutritional yeast, garlic powder, onion powder.
3. Toss tofu pieces in the marinade and let sit for 10–15 minutes.
4. Place tofu on a lined baking sheet and bake for 25–30 minutes, flipping halfway through, until golden and slightly crisp.

#### Braise the cabbage:

1. While the tofu bakes, heat olive oil in a large skillet or saucepan over medium heat.
2. Add onions and cook until soft, about 5 minutes.
3. Add garlic and cook for 1 more minute.
4. Add the sliced cabbage, a pinch of salt and sauté for 5–7 minutes until slightly wilted.
5. Pour in lemon juice and broth, cover, and reduce heat to low. Simmer for 10–15 minutes, stirring occasionally, until cabbage is tender.

#### Serve:

Plate the braised cabbage and top or serve alongside the baked tofu.

\*Add roasted potatoes or quinoa for a fuller meal.

#### Soy Sauce Substitute:

(This is a concentrated seasoning, not a food by itself)

- ½ medium onion, chopped and caramelized in an oiled skillet
- ¼ cup water
- 1 tsp carob powder
- ¼ cup salt
- ½ tsp celery seed
- 2 Tbsp Sucanat or coconut sugar
- 2 ¼ Tbsp lemon juice
- 1 ¼ Tbsp Roma or Pero
- 1 Tbsp onion powder

- 2 Tbsp sunflower seeds, the inside, not the shell
- Blend until smooth.

Due to the salt content, it will not freeze solid and may be scooped out as needed.



Keep in container in freezer.

The cabbage still grows wild in Greece, where it originated.

## *The Uses of Water In Health and Disease*

### ***Magnetic Water***

Within the last few years, the scientific world has been startled with the alleged discovery of "magnetic wells" and "magnetic springs" in various parts of the country. The claim has been made and stoutly defended by interested parties that the water furnished from these sources is magnetic in character, and possesses wonderful healing virtues on that account. The truth in the matter, when viewed in the light of science, seems to be that the water of these much-lauded wells is no more magnetic than any other water; the magnetic phenomena are all explicable by well-known laws of physics, without attaching to the water any magnetic properties. A close examination shows that the iron pipe through which the water passes is the only magnetic object. The supposition that the pipe derives its magnetism from the water is both unnecessary and illogical. In the first place, any iron pipe or rod placed

vertical in the ground—or, better, placed parallel to the earth's axis will spontaneously become magnetic. The production of magnetism is greatly favored by the friction of flowing water, and by jarring, as beating with a hammer. In the second place, the water possesses no magnetism to impart. In view of these facts, the conclusion is inevitable that so-called magnetic water has no existence except in the minds of certain persons whose credulity greatly exceeds their scientific knowledge.

"Magnetic" wells and springs are ingenious humbugs. Thousands of people are duped by them. Hundreds are benefited by getting well washed, and by enjoying recreation and pleasant social surroundings. The curative effects are attributed to the imaginary magnetism, while other more tangible agents are the real means of cure.



# How Do You Resolve It?

*It is one thing to know some verses that help a person stay in the faith, but it is another thing to know the Word in such a way that when a verse seems contradictory to know how to resolve it. True Seventh-day Adventists do not ignore verses. It is our hope that this section will help answer some of those challenges that we may come across personally or be used by others against our beliefs.*

## **Are the Wise Instructed or Not?**

**Luke 10:21, “In that hour Jesus rejoiced in spirit, and said, I thank thee, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that thou hast hid these things from the wise and prudent, and hast revealed them unto babes: even so, Father; for so it seemed good in thy sight.”**

**Proverbs 8:33, “Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not.”**

According to Luke 10:21, the instruction seems to be hidden from the wise, yet Proverbs 8:33 encourages people to hear instruction and be wise. It appears that in one place the wise are on the wrong side of God, but Proverbs 8:33 seems to point out that the wise are on the right side of God.

The patient and careful study of the Word of God is important. If we are impatient with the Word of God, we shall claim that the Bible is too confusing. We cannot take the one word “wise” and declare all verses about wise people are bad, or are good. The Book of Proverbs clearly teaches that to be wise is a good thing, while foolishness is condemned.

Once again, it is the context of the verse that identifies which side the adjective, the word “wise”, happens to appear on. We must ask, why would the wise, intelligent, educated

person have trouble understanding the hidden things of God, and cannot figure them out in Luke 10:21, while others who receive instruction and do not refuse it, are considered wise.

Proverbs 3:7 sheds light on this by telling us, “Be not wise in thine own eyes: fear the LORD, and depart from evil.” Here, we see what actually prevents many of the wise from seeing the hidden things of God – it is their own ego, along with allowing evil to reside within them; be it a little habit here or there, or even a larger habit, with outright sinning.

Likewise, 1 Corinthians 3:18-20 really makes it clear, and even explains both verses in which we are questioning their contrast to each other: “Let no man deceive himself. If any man among you seemeth to be wise in this world, let him become a fool, that he may be wise. For the wisdom of this world is foolishness with God. For it is written, He taketh the wise in their own craftiness. And again, The Lord knoweth the thoughts of the wise, that they are vain.” Many wise people are wise regarding this world. They are wise with their investments in the world, but not wise in investing in souls for Heaven. They are wise to get a good deal, but are neglecting the greatest deal of all, and that is the free gift of salvation. Wisdom in this world is foolishness. In fact, many wise

people have vain thoughts often, be it in keeping up with sports, entertainment, or other distractions. But not all of the wise are condemned. It is recommended, according to these verses in 1 Corinthians, to become a fool in this

world in order to become a wise person before God.

So yes, the wise are to be instructed as long as they give up the evil, the ways of this world, the pride of their own decision-making, etc.



## Authorized KJV vs Catholic Bible

*If you are using anything but the KJV, you are using a Catholic influenced Bible, which strategically twists and leaves out key words and verses so as to make even the ecumenical movement between religions outside of Christianity possible. And Ellen White does identify not to use them for reliability: "Wycliffe's Bible had been translated from the Latin text, which contained many errors." {GC 245.1}. Latin is Catholic or which most modern versions rely upon.*

### Are "For Ever", "Always", "Permanently", Etc. Just Synonyms?

In a general sense, they would be considered synonyms and no big deal, however, especially in an evangelistic series or Bible study, when the term "for ever" is encountered in Revelation 14:11, it takes on a whole new meaning. Revelation 14:11 states, "And the smoke of their torment ascendeth up for ever and ever", and people not understanding the word, "forever", or the phrase, "for ever and ever", think that hell will burn throughout eternity. A Bible teacher, or evangelist, usually turns to 1 Samuel 1:22, which uses the same words: Hannah "will bring him," referring to Samuel, "that he may appear before the LORD, and there abide for ever". Then 1 Samuel 1:28 is brought into the study: "I have lent him to the LORD; as long as he liveth he shall be lent to the LORD." Then the Bible teacher, or evangelist, will make the statement that the term "for ever" simply is a comparative term, and depending on what it is compared to determines the length of time. In this case, it is Samuel's life span, and not eternity. The same is brought out in

comparing Jonah 2:6, with Jonah 1:17, revealing that "for ever" was simply "three days and three nights". The point is, the Bible teacher, or evangelist, is trying to have the student stop thinking that "forever", or "for ever", always means throughout eternity, when it does not. But when the term "for ever" is removed from 1 Samuel 1:22 and replaced with what appears to be a synonym in the modern translations, it makes 1 Samuel 1:22 no longer a proof text [one text which defines, or explains another], undermining comparing scripture with scripture for understanding.

**King James Version:** 1 Samuel 1:22, "But Hannah went not up; for she said unto her husband, [I will not go up] until the child be weaned, and [then] I will bring him, that he may appear before the LORD, and there abide for ever."

## **In Error:**

**Amplified Bible:** But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband, "I will not go up until the child is weaned; and then I will bring him, so that he may appear before the LORD and remain there as long as he lives." [Although this is the correct understanding, it still takes away from the use of the word "forever".]

**Berean Study Bible:** but Hannah did not go. "After the boy is weaned," she said to her husband, "I will take him to appear before the LORD and to stay there permanently."

**Brenton Septuagint Translation:** But Anna did not go up with him, for she said to her husband, I will not go up until the child goes up, when I have weaned him, and he shall be presented before the Lord, and he shall abide there continually.

**Catholic Public Domain Version:** But Hannah did not go up. For she said to her husband, "I will not go, until the infant has been weaned, and until I may lead him, so that he may appear before the sight of the Lord, and may remain always there."

**Christian Standard Bible:** Hannah did not go and explained to her husband, "After the child is weaned, I'll take him to appear in the LORD's presence and to stay there permanently."

**Contemporary English Version:** But Hannah stayed home, because she had told Elkanah, "Samuel and I won't go until he's old enough for me to stop nursing him. Then I'll give him to the LORD, and he can stay there at Shiloh for the rest of his life." [Although this is the correct understanding, it still takes away from the use of the word "forever".]

**Douay-Rheims Bible:** But Anna went not up: for she said to her husband: I will not go till the child be weaned, and till I may carry him, that he may appear before the Lord, and may abide always there.

**GOD'S WORD® Translation:** But Hannah didn't go. She told her husband, "I'll wait until the boy is weaned. Then I'll bring

him and present him to the LORD, and he'll stay there permanently."

**Good News Translation:** But this time Hannah did not go. She told her husband, "As soon as the child is weaned, I will take him to the house of the LORD, where he will stay all his life." [Although this is the correct understanding, it still takes away from the use of the word "forever".]

**Holman Christian Standard Bible:** Hannah did not go and explained to her husband, "After the child is weaned, I'll take him to appear in the LORD's presence and to stay there permanently."

**Literal Standard Version:** And Hannah has not gone up, for she said to her husband, "Until the youth is weaned— then I have brought him in, and he has appeared before the face of YHWH, and dwelt there for all time."

**NET Bible:** but Hannah did not go up with them. Instead she told her husband, "Once the boy is weaned, I will bring him and appear before the LORD, and he will remain there from then on." [Although this is the correct understanding, it still takes away from the use of the word "forever".]

**New American Standard Bible:** But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband, "I will not go until the child is weaned; then I will bring him, so that he may appear before the LORD and stay there for life." [Although this is the correct understanding, it still takes away from the use of the word "forever".]

**New International Version:** Hannah did not go. She said to her husband, "After the boy is weaned, I will take him and present him before the LORD, and he will live there always."

**New Living Translation:** But Hannah did not go. She told her husband, "Wait until the boy is weaned. Then I will take him to the Tabernacle and leave him there with the LORD permanently."

**Young's Literal Translation:** And Hannah hath not gone up, for she said to her husband, 'Till the youth is weaned – then

I have brought him in, and he hath appeared before the face of Jehovah, and dwelt there – unto the age.'

**Correct, this time:**

**A Faithful Version:** But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband, "Until the child is weaned, and then I will bring him so that he may appear before the LORD and stay there forever."

**American Standard Version:** But Hannah went not up; for she said unto her husband, I will not go up until the child be weaned; and then I will bring him, that he may appear before Jehovah, and there abide for ever.

**Bishops' Bible of 1568:** Neuerthelesse, Hanna wet not vp, but sayde vnto her husband: I will tary vntill the lad be weaned, and then I will bryng hym, that he may appeare before the Lord, and there abyde for euer.

**Coverdale Bible of 1535:** Anna wente not vp, but sayde vnto hir husbände: (I wil not go vp) tyll ye childe be weened: then will I brynge him, that he maye appeare before the LORDE, and cotynue there for euer.

**Darby Bible Translation:** But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband, [I will wait] until the child is weaned; then will I bring him, that he may appear before Jehovah, and there abide for ever.

**English Revised Version:** But Hannah went not up; for she said unto her husband, I will not go up until the child be weaned, and then I will bring him, that he may appear before the LORD, and there abide for ever.

**English Standard Version:** But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband, "As soon as the child is weaned, I will bring him, so that he may appear in the presence of the LORD and dwell there forever."

**Geneva Bible of 1587:** But Hannah went not vp: for she sayd vnto her husband, I will tarie vntill the childe be weined, then I will bring him that hee may appeare before the Lord, and there abide for euer.

**International Standard Version:** Hannah did not go up because she had told her husband, "As soon as the child is weaned, I'll take him to appear in the LORD's presence and remain there forever.

**JPS Tanakh 1917:** But Hannah went not up; for she said unto her husband: 'Until the child be weaned, when I will bring him, that he may appear before the LORD, and there abide for ever.'

**Lamsa Bible:** But Hannah did not go up; for she said to her husband, I will wait until the child is weaned, and then I will bring him, that he may appear before the LORD, and there abide forever.

**New Heart English Bible:** But Hannah did not go up; for she said to her husband, "Not until the child is weaned; then I will bring him, that he may appear before the LORD, and stay there forever."

**New King James Version:** But Hannah did not go up, for she said to her husband, "Not until the child is weaned; then I will take him, that he may appear before the LORD and remain there forever."

**Peshitta Holy Bible Translated:** And Hannah did not go up because she said to her husband: "Until the boy is weaned, and I will bring him and he will appear before LORD JEHOVAH and he shall dwell there forever"

**Smith's Literal Translation:** And Hannah went not up; for she said to her husband, Till the boy shall be weaned, and I brought him, and he saw the face of Jehovah, and he shall sit there even to forever.

**Webster's Bible Translation:** But Hannah went not up; for she said to her husband, I will not go up until the child is weaned, and then I will bring him, that he may appear before the LORD, and there abide for ever.

**World English Bible:** But Hannah didn't go up; for she said to her husband, "Not until the child is weaned; then I will bring him, that he may appear before Yahweh, and stay there forever."



# Keep the Sabbath Holy

*Yes, we brought this topic back from the chopping block after finding a new approach and a reader sharing their interest in the article.*

## **An Important Topic to Discuss**

Although this can be discussed any time in the home, Sabbath is when there should be undivided attention to learning. Additionally, this quote is not only for children, though it is introduced that way, it is for all to learn from.

**“Pride, self-esteem, and boldness are marked characteristics of the children of this day; and they are the curse of the age.... The most sacred lessons of modesty and humility are to be taught to the children, both at home and in the Sabbath school” {CG 144.2}.**

From the pulpit, much can be observed, especially in the area of modesty. In giving the benefit of the doubt, clothing ignorance seems to

be rampant, careless, and correction definitely unwanted, especially when approaching God on His holy day in a holy convocation. Showing cleavage among the women of all ages and a lot of leg exposure as well, is no different than dancing around the golden calf in the state of undress during the time of Moses (Exodus 32).

But modesty is not just something for the church service. Modesty is to be practiced all week long.

Just because it is legal for a man to remove his shirt, does not mean it is pleasing to God. That includes tight-fitting clothing that shows every muscle and bicep, whether or not a six pack below the ribs is present. No one ought to be seeing a hairy chest, either.

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As for women, the length of the clothing, especially in the form of a dress, is to be around mid-calf and not mid-thigh! Form-fitting clothing to show the shape of private areas is alarmingly surprising to be found on people getting prepared to meet Jesus.

There is much more to modesty, but the subject of this article is not so much about the modesty as it is about teaching modesty and humility during Sabbath hours. Do not avoid addressing it during Sabbath school. And parents, do make sure the children in the home are being raised in the eyes of God as opposed to the eyes of society. Parents have control over the clothing in the home, but

make sure it is in the heart as well, because many a young lady have left the home one way, changed into another way, and then changed back into the expected, acceptable way to return home. If it is not in the heart, it will not be practiced once they leave the nest, either.

And do not tread lightly on the subject of humility. Pride is very sneaky and comes in all forms, especially when competition is initiated.

Again, the Sabbath is a perfect time to instill values. Make sure modesty and humility are part of them.



## Questions And Answers

**Allow at least three (3) months before your question may appear.**

**Question:** Ellen White states, "I have no faith in casting lots. We have in the Bible a plain 'Thus saith the Lord' in regard to all church duties..." {2SM 328.5}, while Acts 1:26 says, "they gave forth their lots; and the lot fell upon Matthias; and he was numbered with the eleven apostles." Is Ellen White condemning that which is recorded in the Book of Acts?

**Answer:** In the full context of the quote from the original source, Ellen White also stated in the same letter, "I would say to the members of the church in Austin: Read your Bibles with much prayer. Do not try to humble others, but humble yourselves before God, and deal gently with one another. To cast lots for the officers of the church is not in God's order. Let men of responsibility

be called upon to select the officers of the church" {Lt37-1900}.

Now, when we read Acts 1:26, the Bible states, "And they gave forth their lots; and the lot fell upon Matthias; and he was numbered with the eleven apostles." The use of the phrase "they gave forth their lots" is different than John 19:23-24, which says, "Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took his garments, and made four parts, to every soldier a part; and also [his] coat: now the coat was without seam, woven from the top throughout. They said therefore among themselves, Let us not rend it, but cast lots for it, whose it shall be: that the scripture might be fulfilled, which saith, They parted my raiment among them, and for my vesture they did cast lots. These things

therefore the soldiers did.” The soldiers were gambling using chance to gain the prize of the coat without a seam.

To “give forth a lot” is basically casting a vote. After each person had “secretly” cast their vote, they were counted and the vote, or lot, ended up being upon Matthais. Ellen White said to “select the officers of the church” and not be gambling for the position, thinking that God was in the process of the right number on dice to appear, the right stone picked from a bag, the right ... whatever, is left to chance.

So, there is no contradiction between Ellen White and the account in Acts.

**Question:** Since God set the sun, moon, and stars to tell the days, does that mean Thursday (or any day of the week) actually starts at sunset?

**Answer:** God is not connected with Sunday, Monday Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, or Saturday. Those are man-made creations and therefore, can be

recognized as a midnight-to-midnight schedule.

God’s days are first, second, third, fourth, fifth, preparation, and Sabbath. They start and end on sunsets according to the book of Genesis, mostly patterned in the first chapter.

**Question:** When was the first animal sacrifice?

**Answer:** Genesis 3:21 states, “Unto Adam also and to his wife did the LORD God make coats of skins, and clothed them.” The question arises about the source of the skins. God did not just bring them into existence. The animals were killed as the first animal sacrifice. This is how Adam knew to teach his children to follow through with the practice, of which Abel did (Genesis 4:4), but Cain did not (Genesis 4:3).

**Question:** If the people populating the earth were all descendants of Adam and Eve and their children having children, why are only three

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children specifically "known" of Adam and Eve (Genesis 4:1, 2, 25)?

**Answer:** Looking at those three verses, the Bible says, "And Adam knew Eve his wife; and she conceived, and bare Cain, and said, I have gotten a man from the LORD" (Genesis 4:1). "And she again bare his brother Abel. And Abel was a keeper of sheep, but Cain was a tiller of the ground" (Genesis 4:2). "And Adam knew his wife again; and she bare a son, and called his name Seth: For God, [said she], hath appointed me another seed instead of Abel, whom Cain slew" (Genesis 4:25). Those are the only ones mentioned, as you stated.

These are significant actors according to the Genesis 4 account. Cain represented the false worshippers while Abel represented the true. Cain committed the first murder (Genesis 4:8), while Seth, in all intents and purposes, replaced Abel as the faithful line (Genesis 4:26).

Seeing that Cain was afraid of everyone and not just Seth, by saying, "every one that findeth me shall slay me" (Genesis 4:14), implies a large number of people because if it were just three, four, or five, that Cain feared, then they would have been named, as in an example of, "Alma, Barty, and Chaunce, along with Seth, seek to slay me." Of course, I made up the first three names to prove the point. The fact that "everyone" is referenced, means that there are quite a number of other people. Additionally, "Cain knew his wife" (Genesis 4:17). She had to come from some place. So, Adam and Eve had many more children than were named.

Now, the Bible is not in the habit of glorifying the lost unless something significant happened with them. Cain

slew Abel, therefore Cain was mentioned. When Korah rose up against Moses, that is significant. On the other hand, the "two hundred and fifty princes of the assembly, famous in the congregation, men of renown" (Numbers 16:2) that joined Korah are not specifically named because, despite being famous, did not contribute enough to get a mention by name.

We know Adam and Eve had many more children based upon the pattern of Genesis 5. "And the days of Adam after he had begotten Seth were eight hundred years: and he begat sons and daughters" (Genesis 5:4). And that is the pattern for all the descendants with only the godly line being named, or when something significant happened.

And so, Cain, probably marrying his sister, along with multiple descendants to populate the earth are sadly and probably in a lost state, as they "began to multiply on the face of the earth, and daughters were born unto them" (Genesis 6:1). We know the vast majority of Adam and Eve's children and descendants were lost at the time of the flood. All but "eight souls" were destroyed (1 Peter 3:20).

Seth is significant, not only being on the godly side, but beginning the godly lineage that led to Noah and the ark.

So, the first five chapters of the Bible are not to identify every human being, but rather pointing out the godly line, as well as only the lost who played a significant role at that time.



# Making It Plain

## ***How “Forever” Does and Does Not Mean “Eternity”***

Confusion abounds when we see the word “for ever” appearing in a verse like Revelation 14:11, which says, “And the smoke of their torment ascendeth up for ever and ever”. We know that such cannot be true because Revelation 20:9 tells us that “they went up on the breadth of the earth, and compassed the camp of the saints about, and the beloved city: and fire came down from God out of heaven, and devoured them”, and Malachi 4:1, 3 says, “For, behold, the day cometh, that shall burn as an oven; and all the proud, yea, and all that do wickedly, shall be stubble: and the day that cometh shall burn them up, saith the LORD of hosts, that it shall leave them neither root nor branch. And ye shall tread down the wicked; for they shall be ashes under the soles of your feet in the day that I shall do [this], saith the LORD of hosts.” The lost cannot burn throughout eternity if they are devoured and reduced to ashes.

More confusion reigns when we see verses with the word “forever”, or the words, “for ever”, applied to those things that will last throughout eternity: “We have heard out of the law that Christ abideth for ever” (John 12:34). And we are told, “Thy throne, O God, [is] for ever and ever” (Psalms 45:6). Both are eternal.

Even more confusion comes about when we see a verse like, “For all the land which thou seest, to thee will I give it, and to thy seed for ever” (Genesis 13:15), causing wars today because people are believing that the land of Israel belongs to the Jews as it was promised to Abram. And another

verse of “Behold, I build an house to the name of the LORD my God, to dedicate [it] to him, [and] to burn before him sweet incense, and for the continual shewbread, and for the burnt offerings morning and evening, on the sabbaths, and on the new moons, and on the solemn feasts of the LORD our God. This [is an ordinance] for ever to Israel” (2 Chronicles 2:4) making people think we need to still be keeping the feast days and floating sabbath days despite being told that they “are a shadow of things to come” (Colossians 2:17).

Certainly, the words “for ever” cannot be throughout eternity when Samuel is not serving in the temple anymore (compare 1 Samuel 1:22 to 1 Samuel 1:28) or Jonah who declared to be in the stomach of the sea creature for ever (compare Jonah 2:6 to Jonah 1:17).

The words “for ever” are a relative term. Depending upon the context determines the meaning just like the word “tall”. The word “tall” does not have a fixed height. We cannot say that seven feet is tall. Yes, if we are talking about a human, seven feet is tall. If we are talking about the distance between the floor and ceiling in a house, not so much. And definitely a giraffe of only seven feet would not be considered tall among its species. And do not forget about a tree in which seven feet is not at all that tall.

So, “for ever” when compared to God’s law and Himself, does mean eternal as God is eternal (1 Timothy

1:17) and His commandments are as well (Psalms 105:10).

All other objects are not eternal, including Israel being a favored nation still, which it is not (Matthew 21:43).

Also, we must remember when we make a compound word out of two separate words, meanings can be drastically changed, or at least challenging to understand. The word 'for' is a preposition which can take a sentence in many different directions. Think of "food is for eating" (denoting purpose), compared to "pound for pound" (denoting comparative

measurement), compared to "I walk for health" (denoting aim or reason), compared to "my road is dirt and gravel for one mile" (denoting distance) .... You could fill up this page with usage, and they all need to be considered even with this one little word and can change meaning in a sentence easily and drastically.

Then there is the word 'ever', which is actually an adverb which describes action, mostly having to do with time of various lengths, surprising to most people because we were taught that adverbs end in 'ly', but that is not always the case.



## Watchman, Let Him Declare What He Seeth

When you can stand forth a free man again, owing no man anything, you will have achieved a great victory" {AH 393.4,5}.
